




GIVING/COLLECTIONS

Canon Andrew writes:

On Saturday 16th January, Salisbury Cathedral opened its doors as a venue for the Sarum South Primary Care Network Covid-19 Local Vaccination Service.

On the day, local GPs invited patients in the over 80s priority group to attend to have their first Covid-19 jab.

Director of Music David Halls and Assistant Director John Challenger provided a programme of music throughout the day on the famous Father Willis organ.
